

BY WAY of useless information, it is within my power at this moment to reveal the name of the man who stored up the greatest fund of useless information ever known.

His name is Sid and he is a London taxi driver. His most treasured piece of useless information is a description of how he became a cabbie.

It seems that before you can obtain a licence for the aforesaid occupation it is necessary to prove your knowledge of the streets and districts of London.

To acquire this knowledge, every potential taxi driver has to take part in something called, quaintly enough, "The Knowledge."

This means, basically, that he must spend his most formative years cycling the streets of London in order to acquire an unequalled expertise of City and suburbs.

It just so happens that the leading character in Taxi, one of VOK's newer imports from the BBC is also called Sid (played by Sid James). It also just so happens that I gave the announcement that VOK had purchased this series the sort of welcome usually reserved for cold baked beans at a champagne breakfast.

Sid James, of course, is a natural for the lead part and he is ably supported, as they say in show-biz land, by the rest of the regular cast.

I AM unreliably informed by somebody who has no connection with VOK that our television bosses are about to buy a top hat and name for Norbert Okare so that he can fill in with a few song-and-dance routines when there is nothing else lying around the studios to fill an unusual break.


For good old Norbert is nothing if not versatile. News reading, interviewing, announcing, reading advertisements - Norbert is, indeed, a man for all reasons.



TOM MBOYA SHOT DEAD

Killer at city shop escapes

AN ASSASSIN gunned down Mr. Tom Mboya at lunch-time today in the crowded city centre of Nairobi.

The Minister for Economic Planning and Development died minutes later while being rushed to Nairobi Hospital.

The assassin, described as a young African, made his getaway in a car after the shooting, which occurred about 1.15 pm, in Queen Chania's restaurant above St. George's Hotel. The most serious police hunt in Kenya's history is being under way for the killer.

Mr. Mboya, who was aged 38, was leaving the restaurant after making purchases when the attack occurred. The assassin, a tall black of dark complexion, wearing a light blue shirt, shot the Minister in the chest.

Mr. Mboya fell to the ground and apparently stopped breathing immediately. He was taken to Nairobi Hospital and taken to the operating room. A major surgical operation was carried out, but apparently without success. He died at 1.45 pm.





him in forming a company, the Virani Steel Works Limited, which came into being at the end of 1969. Six years later, with business prospering, Mr. Virani's health failed and he retired. Jayantilal took over the business — and changed the name to the East African Steel Works Limited.

Within three years he realised that the market was too small to support both his company and its competitors, the Kenya Aluminium and Industrial Works Limited — so they amalgamated, and changed the name to East African Wire Industries Limited.

They had come a long way from the original steel-making machinery. The new company was producing twisted wire steel wire, welded mesh and reinforcing steel fabric.

Now there has been another change of name, to EA Wire Industries Limited and the Development Finance Company of Kenya have passed resources to form the Kenya United Steel Company Limited which will produce rolled bar and rods for the growing building trade — with Jayantilal as managing director.

EXPANSION PATH

The company will import the steel billets — and following the logical expansion path apparent in the growth so far, it could logically be expected that the next stage would be to branch into a steel-making plant.

"This might come," he said, "but before that we will branch into the production of advanced wire."

Is expansion vital in business? "Yes, definitely," he answered. "Without it you don't survive. Without it you don't grow. You have to invest in it and you have to invest in it to succeed. There is no drama here."

One of the things which surprised me, as a younger man, was the fact that I always wanted to see business ways, he said. "When I was in the school, I had to go into the family business for the purpose of going abroad for further education, so I was determined to go into business. I wanted to be able to see the

world." In fact, Jayantilal has been apart to go to England, several parts of Europe, India, Japan and Hongkong, as well as nearer home, the United Arab Emirates, Sudan and of course, East Africa.

He feels that, though in fact of fairly new, East Africa still lacks the backbone of business experience. "I have had 'extra something' presented to you large private enterprises. They certainly have the ability," he believes, "but have had too short a time to offset their lack of experience in business, experience which often, but not always, comes from the family background."

He feels that despite this lack of business aptitude — the industrial sector decision — there are some excellent African executives who are busy making up for the experience their years seem allowed in accumulation.

He pointed the progress wages had made during the course of his business life. "The growth of industry in Kenya in the past few years has been staggering," he said, "and wages naturally have gone up with it. When I started the steel factory, the ADI can labourers were getting \$2.5 a month. The minimum now for the same job is \$12."

A keen sportsman, and an active one (despite his being busy playing football), Jayantilal is a cricket fanatic, maintaining a cricket kit with every available opportunity for watching it. Even business trips to England are timed to coincide with Test matches.

He takes an active part in the Club's social life, being on the Board of Governors of the Club Girls' High School, as well as taking a keen interest in social work within his own Lokomo community. Last year he became vice-chairman of the Club Rotary, and is on the Club Service Committee.

Although the family business improved him in the opportunity for a "first" of success, he has more than made up for it. After all, he started the country's first steel factory, was the first to produce molten iron, then hot-rolled wire, then drawn steel wire and now will run the country's first steel rolling mill — which is a big record for any one man.
